Serving Nottinghamshire since 2007, Bitesize is a catering social enterprise.

Bitesize creates bespoke buffets and canapé menus to suit every occasion, diet and cultural requirement. Some of the highlights of the year include catering for 500 of the Lord Lieutenants guests at Southwell Minster and serving canapés at an awards ceremony hosted by Nottingham Building Society.

During the six years of trading Bitesize has been instrumental in teaching catering skills to hundreds of volunteers and trainees, some of whom now hold senior positions within EVE Trades and other catering businesses.

The Outram Street Arts and Media Studios has seen many changes in 2012, including a change of name and the dissolving of our partnership with Confetti Institute of Creative Technologies.

Every cloud has a silver lining and we have taken this opportunity to establish ourselves as the creative hub of Sutton in Ashfield with our state-of-the-art recording studio and iMac Suite.

In addition the studios provide a venue for arts and media events including the Sutton Sessions, a series of gigs celebrating the talents of local bands and artists.

"The centre provides so much opportunity for local people that was just not here before. My mum, for example, would never have dreamed of going to a live music event before the Sutton Sessions started here - now she comes all the time.

It is a real social hub and there is nothing like it anywhere else in the area. I really think it has made a huge impact and that the town would be a much poorer place without it. It provides opportunities for local people to show what they can do."



Paint It is contracted by Framework Housing Association to redecorate all of its supported accommodation across the region.

By using a social enterprise that employs former service users,

Framework's tenants can see first hand how they too can change their lives by engaging with Paint It.



"I was unemployed and hadn't worked for nearly 15 years when my children were growing up. I never thought that I would end up doing this type of thing but I have really enjoyed it. It has given me more confidence and encouraged me to do new things - I've even been out and done my driving test! I feel there are many different routes that I can take in the future. Before coming to Paint It I did not feel that I had those options."














Woodpeckers, located in the Workshop, is a wood craft and recycling project that makes and restores bespoke items of gifts and furniture. People can learn advanced carpentry skills and find an avenue for their creativity.

Person 2 Person is a domestic care and social inclusion agency that works with vulnerable clients and their carers in their homes. Person 2 Person offers personal support with getting up or going to bed, washing and dressing, shopping and preparing meals. It also offers companionship services and holistic services such as massage, hair dressing and relaxation techniques.

There has been enormous growth in the business during 2012. We now employ more than 60 staff, after starting with just 30, and we support more than 100 clients, which has grown from 60.

Choice and dignity is at the heart of everything Person 2 Person does.











"Working at P2P happened at a really good time for me.

I had experienced issues with my mental health a few years before and enjoyed the experience of helping others.

I started in 2011 as a Social Inclusion Worker. This involved helping vulnerable people back into society and moving forward with their lives by breaking down and reducing their personal and social barriers.

"Working there gave me the know how to move on to my next role. The whole experience was a good pathway towards achieving what I wanted to achieve with my career.
